free time at the gardens.



Camden Park House and Garden:

Visit historic Camden Park (c1835). Designed by colonial architect John Verge and built for wool industry pioneers John & Elizabeth Macarthur. Camden Park is one of Australia's most important and intact Georgian houses.

You are free to walk through the house and garden at your own pace. There is a guide in each room of the house. There will also be plant, gifts and produce stalls.



Camden Park House:

Work began on the house in 1831 to a design by the architect John Verge and was finished about 1835. Verge's design for the house was based on the Palladian principle of a central two storied block flanked by symmetrical pavilions; the pavilion to the north west extended into an enclosed courtyard. The house was built of stuccoed sandstock brick on sandstone foundations, which doubled as a cellar. Window mouldings, porticos, parapets and the single-piece columns were made of the local Hawkesbury sandstone. The labour was provided by convicts assigned to the Macarthurs.

Verge's design of the house, although based on a European pattern, has proved appropriate for the extremes of the Australian climate and to the changing patterns of social behaviour. The only major addition occurred in the 1880s, when a second storey was added to the North West wing. The informal layout of the rooms contrasts with the formal exterior and

accurately reflects fashions of the 1830s.



Camden Park Garden:

The house was positioned on a rise amid planting that had begun in 1820. The natural Eucalyptus bushland was selectively cut to create vistas looking towards the village of Camden, Mt Annan and Mt Gilead and to provide an Arcadian setting for the white, Doric-colonnaded house.

Today it is the largest intact 19th century garden in New South Wales and demonstrates the informal 'picturesque' style of garden design favoured in the early part of the 19th century. This has been overlaid by a later, more formal, `gardenesque' style. The layout of the garden and the exotic planting are credited to William, who achieved considerable fame not only as a horticulturist but also as a promoter of viniculture. William introduced Camellia japonica Anenomiflora', today the oldest surviving Camellia in Australia; it continues to flourish at the southern corner of the garden front colonnade. Today a dedicated group of volunteers are maintaining this heritage garden.
