## BERRY GARDENS: (number of gardens to be visited on the day would depend on time)

Garden No. 1 - 511 Coolangatta Road - 'Summercloud Hill'.

Visit this 3 acre country garden and you will find hedged garden rooms containing many exquisite roses, Camellias, cacti and succulents together with a wide variety of exotic plants and trees, reflecting the varied interests of the enthusiastic owners of this established garden. Enjoy magnificent views to the escarpment.

### Garden No. 2 - Corner Victoria & Albany Streets

'The Berry Court House'- This Eco garden has been evolving since 2000. The area consisted of 2 paddocks beside the Court House. Reflection ponds at the entrance lead to a Xeriscape (dry garden). A hedged formal garden hides roses, a crab apple walk and many other specialized plantings. The driveway garden features prize winning Camellias

### Garden No. 3 - 10 King Street, Berry

This town block includes a formal front garden featuring a fountain, glossy green and white plantings of Gardenias, Magnolias and white Agapanthas. A more relaxed cottage garden at the rear includes a special chook house, raised sandstone vegetable gardens, espaliered fruit trees, pool and a new tree house, slide and sand pit for the kids.

### Garden No. 4 - 14 Kentia Crescent, Berry

This easy care 1 acre garden has a variety of trees scattered through the front lawn and fruit trees in the back. Featured throughout the garden are Agapanthus, roses, orchids, Dahlias, Cliveas, Iris, Azaleas, Wisteria, hedges of Gardenias, Conifers, Photinia and Camellias. There is also a covered vegetable garden with seasonal vegetables. Berry Garden Club's Plant Sales are located at this garden.

### Garden No. 5 - 5 Kentia Crescent, Berry

The front garden is a combination of cottage garden, Sasanqua Camellias and large trees including Claret Ash and Pines. The back garden is park like with many large trees and underplantings of Cliveas, lilies and shrubs. A small pond at the back boundary is highlighted by surrounding Silver Birch. A nice little walk.

### Garden No. 6 - 153 Kangaroo Valley Road, Berry

"We think it's finished" - 12 years in the making. Significant structures and landscaping elements take full advantage of the natural setting and complement this lovely cottage/open plan garden. The garden also features an octagonal vegetable garden that utilizes a chook tractor.

### Garden No 7 - 15 Bundewallah Road, Berry

This one acre cottage garden has developed gradually over the last 25 years from an over-grown paddock to a beautiful peaceful place to enjoy a garden full of Camellias, roses, perennials and annuals with a backdrop of the majestic escarpment and rural outlook.

Garden No. 8 - 246 Bundewallah Road, Bundewallah - 'Raybrook'

A park like garden 6 years in the making with stunning cedars, Ficus and exotic trees. The constantly changing Bundewallah Creek and abundant wildlife make this garden something to behold. Approximately 80% of the 5 acres was covered with weeds. The garden was always there - it just needed revealing. The rock wall entrance is an added feature.

#### Berry Bowling Club:

The Berry Bowling Club, known as the family club, is located at the north entrance to Berry on the banks of Broughton Creek. A main meal, dessert and tea/coffee will be served.
