Elegans Garden, Galston

Elegant is a five acres of wonderful garden at Galston. Four man-made lakes are the central feature of this informal park-like garden, which has been the result of over 20 years of labour by its owner Bill Fleming, a dedicated plantsman who has transformed a bare five-acre block into a garden of great distinction.

Foliage and flowers are reflected in the tranquil lakes, with plantings of lilies and irises rimming the banks. Relax on the sunny lawns overlooking the lakes. Garden beds are overflowing with something new being added all the time. Paths meander in all directions through the shrubbery, leading to something new and unexpected at every turn. A rainforest area contains many unusual native trees including grevilleas and a large tree waratah. It is a garden not to be missed.

Fagans Park

Fagan Park is an area of approx. 55 hectares. The site was donated by Fagan family to the Crown with Hornsby Shire Council appointed as sole trustee for the park. The park was adopted as council's bicentennial project and was officially opened in Nov. 1988. Some of the attractions of the Park: The Gardens of Many Nations (10 ha of gardens); Netehrby Homestead – the original Fagan family home; Rural museums; Eco Garden – an educational, sustainable garden and many others features.

Galston Club

The Club was established in March 1968 and since our refurbishment in December 1999 has built up a reputation for good food, good service and good times. A main meal, dessert and tea/coffee will be served.
